Course: GLS-120 Education Experience Abroad (Humanities Credit)

In this course, you will gain a global view of agriculture and humanities. The program will broaden your world perspective through research, travel and immersion in Brazilian culture. Cultural activities will include spending time with Brazilian students at Universidade Federal de Lavras (UFLA) to experience life on campus, touring historical towns and sites near Lavras and Rio and meeting with local agriculturalists. The format of the course will involve face-to-face meetings prior to departure, a series of in-country journaling activities and a final project summarizing your experiences.

The Country:

The Country Brazil is home to one-half of South America's total population, and is the world's third largest democracy. As a nation of contrast, diversity and rich cultural heritage, Brazil offers a study abroad experience unlike any other. - Wednesday, March 13:** Depart Cedar Rapids
- Thursday, March 14:** Arrive in Sao Paulo, travel to Lavras, Check in
- Friday, March 15:** Tour UFLA campus, Lunch at the University Restaurant, Arrive at Gammon Institute
