Course: GLS-120 Education Experience Abroad (Humanities Credit)

This program was developed through a partnership between Zealand Institute of Business and Technology (ZIBAT) in Denmark and Kirkwood in the United States. You will explore comparative differences between the United States, Denmark and the entire European community, with emphasis in entrepreneurship, creativity and innovation. You will study, work and travel together with Danish college students focusing on topics like: how to start up a new company, trend analysis, cultural differences and communication styles.

The Country:

Welcome to Denmark - the happiest place on Earth! This Scandinavian country— located just north of Germany – is your destination for study abroad. Denmark features beautiful landscapes, eco-friendly cities, while still maintaining medieval Viking charm. Once the seat of Viking raiders, Denmark has evolved into a modern, prosperous nation. It's a modern market economy with up-to-date, small-scale and corporate industry, extensive government welfare measures, comfortable living standards, a stable currency and a high dependence on foreign trade.
