Top Higher Education Institutions (Dollars and Jobs)

A report by **NAFSA**: **Association of International Educators**, confirms Kirkwood is still the 7th highest enrolling higher education institution for international student enrollment (F-1/J-1) in the state and #1 in the community college sector in lowa. Although our overall international student enrollment has declined on par with the national trend, we are still at the top of the lowa list.

International students studying at U.S. colleges and universities contribute **\$41.0 billion** and support **458,290 jobs** to the U.S. economy.* **For every seven international students, three U.S. jobs are created** and supported by spending occurring in the higher education, accommodation, dining, retail, transportation, telecommunications and health insurance sectors.

International Student Alumni of the Month



Cesar Tox is this month's International Student Alum. Cesar is from Guatemala and attended Kirkwood as part of the SEED program from 2009-2011. He studied Agriculture Production and since returning home he has become very involved in NGO's and community volunteer work. He

started with Medical Teams International as a Coordinator of International Volunteers. This involved taking groups of people from the US to rural communities and translating to them from a Mayan (O'eqchi') Language to English. Five years later he moved to another Nonprofit organization called Pencils of Promise, https://pencilsofpromise.org/ as a Development Assistant to build schools and programs to create access to quality education for Pre & Primary students in rural communities. Cesar remembers his time at Kirkwood as being invaluable for learning English and for meeting people around the world who he stays in touch with to this day.

Study Abroad Alumni of the Month



Nathan Peterson is from lowa City, IA. He was a student on the 2016 Layers of Rome Study Abroad Program, of which he said it opened his eyes. "Italy was a dream that I never thought I would be able to see in person. Having the opportunity to go

abroad and see places that captured my imagination as a young boy gave me the realization that there's so much I can accomplish." The experience in Rome was transformative for Nathan. The next winter he traveled back to Italy to teach English as a Second Language in Milan. "I wouldn't have had that courage if I hadn't studied abroad to Rome." Nathan is finishing his liberal arts degree at Kirkwood this spring. Next, he will be obtaining his TEFL Certification and attending the University of Iowa for a degree in History and Secondary Education. Nathan hopes to return to Italy more permanently in the future. "I know that there's a world yet to explore and I aim to see as much of it as I can while doing what I've grown to love. Teaching!"
