Kirkwood Selected for Virtual Exchange Program

International program to build global competencies and career readiness skills

CEDAR RAPIDS, Iowa (June 25, 2019)-Kirkwood Community College has joined a consortium of postsecondary education leaders for a virtual exchange program intended to give 3,000 students career readiness skills through a business competition across the United States, Jordan and Iraq.

Selected to participate in the fall 2019 International Research & Exchanges Board (IREX) Global Solutions Sustainability Challenge, Kirkwood will join 12 other academic institutions from around the world. The program is supported by the Stevens Initiative, which is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State. It's funded by the U.S. Government and administered by the Aspen Institute.

"Students in this program will learn important lessons that they can apply all over the world," said Dawn Wood, Dean of Kirkwood's International Programs. "As the world gets more technologically advanced, it becomes much smaller. Business is now increasingly done on a global scale and students need the skills they will develop because of this exciting project."

The Global Solutions Sustainability Challenge connects students in the United States, Jordan and Iraq to virtually collaborate on a sustainable solution to a contemporary business challenge. Binational teams engage during a six to ten-week period to create a sustainable business solution to a challenge identified by industry partners across business sectors. Throughout the challenge, participants will develop workforce skills, network with industry professionals and participate in a virtual career fair.

The program will include five separate cohorts beginning this September and continue through spring 2021

The month of June was a busy month for study abroad, as over 30 students, faculty, and staff completed study abroad programs. Here are some highlights:



The **Layers of Rome** group in Italy was led by faculty leaders Renee Schlueter and Scott Samuelson. This study abroad experience is one of Kirkwood's longest standing faculty led programs. This year the students explored all the sites of the Eternal City, guided with literature, philosophy, history, and art, as well as, excursions to Florence and Pompeii.



The **Italy, Culinary Arts Group** led by Chef Anthony Green and Michael Barshis completed a 3week course in Florence, Italy with Florence University of the Arts (FUA). Students either took a Traditions of Italy course, or they completed an internship at Ganzo, FUA's on-campus restaurant.



The Morocco Service-Learning group worked in Azrou, Morocco with partner Cross Cultural Solutions. The program was led by faculty leader Shelby Myers, along with Kirkwood Global Service Awardees, Jenna Hunt (One Stop) and Eliot Blake (English).
